The French women work at Crepe Cherie and have impressed locals with their Gallic charms and crepe-making prowess.

Paris born and bred Agathe and Toulouse-raised Amelie whip up savoury crepes (galettes), sweet versions and delicious coffee.

“They have even got people eating a crepe complete – which has a soft egg – for breakfast,” said shop co-owner Eliza Carson.

Early fans include staff from western suburbs detectives. The policemen drop by every day to get their coffee fix.

“My husband Corran is known as ‘the crepe dude’ by locals,” Eliza said.
